Nursery Survey Feedback

Total number of surveys completed: 13

1) Quality of care, support and learning

My child is welcomed and supported at nursery. 13 parents strongly agreed

I am happy with the quality of care my child receives: 13 parents strongly agreed

I feel my child enjoys nursery and is happy here. 13 parents strongly agreed

The nursery provides my child with experiences which support them to develop confidence and establish relationships. 13 parents strongly agreed

My child is provided with activities which are appropriate for their stage of development. 12 parents strongly agreed and 1 somewhat agreed.

I feel the children's interests are taken into account when activities are being planned. 12 parents strongly agreed and 1 somewhat agreed.

The nursery provides enough information in regards to activity planning and next steps. 10 parents strongly agreed, 2 somewhat agreed and 1 parent answered as neutral.

The nursery provides enough opportunities to talk about my child's care and development. 12 parents strongly agreed and 1 somewhat agreed.

The nursery is aware and supportive of my child's individual needs. 12 parents strongly agreed and 1 somewhat agreed.

The nursery provides helpful advice/guidance about activities we can do at home to support my child's learning and development. 9 parents strongly agreed, 2 somewhat agreed and 2 parents answered as neutral.

The nursery provides enough information in regards to upcoming events. 13 parents strongly agreed

The nursery provides a well balanced and nutritious menu. 11 parents strongly agreed and 2 somewhat agreed.

2) Quality of Environment

The nursery is kept clean and in good working order. 12 parents strongly agreed and 1 somewhat agreed.

The nursery is a safe place for children to attend. 13 parents strongly agreed.

The nursery is well equipped. 11 parents strongly agreed and 2 somewhat agreed.

The notice boards in the nursery are informative and easy to access. 10 parents strongly agreed, 2 somewhat agreed and 1 parents answered as neutral.

I like the handovers I receive about my child's day at nursery. 12 parents strongly agreed and 1 somewhat agreed

Individual comments:

Our response / feedback:

We are extremely happy with the response to the survey and the feedback we have received. In light of these results we would like to communicate the following:

Tapestry

We are extremely happy with the feedback we have received from parents with regards to Tapestry. We are so pleased that all parents love seeing the observations we put up of your children onto Tapestry. We will always aim to put at least one observation a week on your child. However we understand that parents would like to see more of the learning activities we do posted on here too. We have spoken about this as a team and the staff in the rooms will make sure to post pictures of the children doing the planned activities each day.

We also had a comment asking for more information on what parents should put on Tapestry at home. This is an excellent suggestion! We have now made a guide for parents on what type of observations you can add of your child (which relate to the EYFS curriculum), from things you may have observed at home. These guides will be sent out separately on email, and will be posted on our parent Facebook Group.

Raising money or Donations

We have never raised money for toys for the setting before as we like to do different charity events through out the year such as Red Nose Day and Children in Need. However, we have spoken about this as a team and we feel that if there was a large item we would like to buy, we may decide to do a fundraising event to help us make some money to put towards our purchase of the item. Toilet Training Policy

At Daisy Chain we aim to support children's health, wellbeing and development by promoting effective toilet training at an appropriate time.

Learning to use the toilet is a big event in a young child's life. Toilet training is a complex process and we aim to support parents and carers through this process with their children.

Toilet training can be a very daunting process for families. At Daisy Chain we will support families by discussing expectations of potty training, and providing information through our Toilet Training Leaflet. The child's Key Person will discuss Toilet Training during the transition meeting to Toddler Room.

Families will be supported to decide the best time to toilet train their child. We believe that it is helpful for the same approach to be taken at home and in the early years setting, including using the same words for wee/poo/potty/toilet etc.

The first stage of toilet training is to recognise when the child is ready. It is essential that the child is:

- Pooing at least one soft poo a day
- Staying dry for at least an hour and a half between wees

Other signs to look out for are:

- Showing interest in the toilet
- They can follow simple instructions
- Able to sit themselves on the potty and get up again
- Starting to show signs of awareness of when they have done a wee or a poo
- Showing awareness that other family members and peers don't wear nappies, and that they use the toilet

Children with additional needs may not show reliable signs of awareness. Toilet training children with additional needs should **not** be delayed; it is much harder to achieve when the child is older. Readiness can be assessed by monitoring the child's wees and poos. If your child is showing the first signs of toilet training (see above) then Initially your child will slowly be encouraged to use the toilet/potty at home. If your child successfully uses the toilet on a regular basis and is beginning to understand when they feel they need to go then we can start the toilet training process at nursery.

During the transitional period, it is paramount that each child's self esteem and confidence remains high. Whilst toilet training at nursery we will:

- Continue to record each nappy change on our nappy sheets.
- In the early stages of toilet training children who are still in nappies will be gently encouraged to sit on the toilet/potty every time their nappy is being changed.
- Once they are ready, children will transfer from nappies to underwear (or pull ups if necessary) and escorted to the toilet regularly.
- We ask that parents ensure that there are always 4 full sets of spare clothes in their child's bag in case their child needs to be changed on more than one occasion.
- Parents are asked to dress their children in sensible clothes, easy to take on and off independently, no dungarees, belts or tricky buttons.
- Children will be reminded to go to the toilet every 30 minutes by a member of staff and a record will be kept of their toileting throughout the day.

- Accidents will be dealt with sensitively. Older children will be encouraged to undress and dress themselves with an adult there to support and offer reassurance. Younger children will be supported and helped a little more, but will still be encouraged to help with dressing.
- If a child is in underwear and had persistent accidents (4 or more) in one day, we will put a pull up or a nappy back on them to save further upset, anxiety and stress for the child.
- If persistent accidents continue and no understanding is shown we will advise that you may need to delay potty training for a short while and resume at a later date.
- Staff will always give positive praise and encouragement after each visit to the toilet, reward charts may also be used.
